WHO REMEMBERS MARY?

A few years ago at one of our get togethers at Nagambie Mary and her husband Des joined us and like all of us had a great time. Recently, two of our members, Ron and Di Sinclair came across Mary and noticed a Royal Flair caravan. This is how Ron writes about a great lady.

“We were camped in Cootamundra, NSW and just heading out for a walk when we noticed a lady camped nearby in a Royal Flair caravan. We always chat to fellow Royal Flairians if we get the chance, so we said hello and asked her if she was happy with her van. She was very happy but it turns out there’s much more to the story than that.

Mary and her husband Des bought the Royal Flair eleven years ago in Adelaide and they towed it with a 1973 Chrysler 2-door Coupe that was fitted with a 318 cu in V8! They set off on their adventure and did over 50,000 kms trouble free caravanning over about nine years.

I’m writing this on the 9th March 2021, and that’s important to the story because it was two years ago today that Des died. Mary was heartbroken and as they had no children she was left alone in a different state with the Chrysler and the Royal Flair. The date is also relevant because while we were chatting to Mary she also mentioned that her brother was being cremated TODAY and she was unable to get there.

By now we were getting emotional and so was Mary, so we steered the conversation back to the caravan. Mary told us that she’d definitely buy another Royal Flair if she ever had the chance because they were so well built, but that was very unlikely. She’d had to sell the fabulous old Chrysler Coupe when Des died and now she doesn’t even have a licence. While we were chatting she was getting the battery checked in the van and it turns out it was the original battery. She told us that the last time they’d used the battery when free-camping was about three years ago, so now she’s going to get a new one. She did say that she might need to get a ‘new sticker’ on the front of the van as the old one is peeling off, so I told her I’d look into that for her.

Mary has now made her home in her much-loved Royal Flair at Cootamundra Caravan Park and she said she feels “very lucky” to live in such a comfortable van in such a lovely and friendly town. She was very pleased to tell us that the park owners let her do some cleaning so she could keep busy, and for that she is grateful. We took Mary’s picture with the van and she showed us a few photos of the van and car when they first bought it. What a great glimpse back into the past.

By now we could see Mary was becoming even more upset so we thanked her for sharing her story and went back to our van. Di and I were very moved by meeting this lovely lady and Di suggested that we buy her some flowers to brighten her day. We went straight out and bought a bunch of flowers and Di gave them to Mary with a lovely hug. Sometimes you just meet the loveliest people who take what life throws at them and still feel ‘lucky’”.
